WHAT IS ROTARY?



- Rotary is a global network of community volunteers.
- Who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards.
- Help build goodwill and peace in the world.
- · More than 34,000 clubs and 1.2 million members.
- Conduct projects to address illiteracy, disease, hunger, poverty, lack of clean water, and environmental concerns.
- Youth Exchange is just one of many Rotary programs that seek to make the world a better place

History of the Youth Exchange Program

- Exchanges between Rotary clubs in California and Latin American countries began in 1939.
- •In 1972 the program expanded to include over 58 countries and more than 8,000 youths per year.

Purpose of Rotary Youth Exchange

- World Peace
- Offers young people the opportunity to experience the cultures, problems, and accomplishments of people in another country.
- Participants return home with a broader view of the world and a deeper understanding of themselves.

Short Term Exchange Currently Accepting Applications – Due October 10th

- 45-60 day family-to-family exchange
- Takes place during the summer
- Students are matched based on age, gender, country preference, and interests
- Exchanges are between District 5080 students and students from Europe, South America, & Japan.
- Applications due on October 10th

Short Term Exchange - COSTS

\$700 US Paid to Rotary

- Includes medical/travel insurance
- Orientation
- Administrative costs
- First half (\$350 US) due March 1st
- Remaining (\$350 US) due at May orientation camp



Short Term Exchange - COSTS

Student/Parent Costs

- Airfare
- Modest gift for host family
- Spending money
- Room/board, recreational & sightseeing costs when hosting foreign student in your home
- Family required to host student



Long Term Exchange Currently Accepting Applications – Due October 10th

How Long Does It Last?

- Long term exchanges are for an academic year and vary from 10 to 11 ½ months depending on the country.
- Students depart in the July-September period and return after the end of the academic year.

Qualifications

- Qualified students between the age of 15 and 18 on August 1 of departure year.
- Students who have graduated from high school as of Aug 1 of departure year are not eligible for the program.
- Qualified applicants who are: academically above average, articulate, and demonstrate community leadership skills.

Long Term Youth Exchange Costs

- US \$7000.00 paid in four installments.
- The fee includes:
 - Round trip airfare
 - Full medical insurance
 - Outbound orientation for youth and parents
 - Personal business cards with photo
 - District patches, pins and regalia

Other Costs Long Term

The Fee does not include:

- A required \$300-\$500 emergency fund (refundable)
- Passport VISAS
- Travel expenses, if any, for Visa acquisition
- A required blazer
- School uniforms where required (Host Club may purchase)
- Optional tours, miscellaneous and personal expenses in host country
- Language learning programs such as Rosetta Stone
- Language Camps



Youth Exchange Calendar Long Term

- September-October Completed Preliminary Applications
 - Due October 10th
- October 11th-30th Club Interviews
 - Selection of applicants by the Rotary Clubs
- December 1
 - Completed applications and \$500 US due to District
- December District Interviews

Calendar Continued Long-term

- February 1–Second payment due \$1500
- February-Youths notified of the country to which they will be sent
- April 1–Third payment due \$2,500
- December through May Mandatory Monthly Virtual Meetings as scheduled
- May 3-5, 2024.—Youths and parent/s attend weekend orientation program at Camp Lutherhaven.
- June 1–Final payment due \$2,500
- July August–Students depart to their host countries
- Return June or July next year

Parents consider being a Host Family – Not mandatory but recommended for long-term exchanges

- Host student for 3-4 months
- Be part of your family: included in all family activities
- Qualify Background Checks, Home Review, Training
- Provide: Room and Board, Home environment

Scholarships?

- Various Clubs may have funding
- Youth Exchange Assistance Scholarship (YEAS) based on need
- Rotary District 5080 Youth Exchange Conger Memorial Scholarship
 - Your sponsoring Rotary club applies for you.
 - Must provide evidence of financial need.
 - Must be matched by Sponsoring Rotary Club.
 - District awards are up to \$500. But can be higher under special circumstances.
